Dear Friends,

We invite you to the ECCB and PCUSA Partnership Conference organized by the Czech Mission Network in the United States and the American Working group of the ECCB in Prague. This conference follows the conferences held in Prague in 2008, Annapolis in 2012, and Prague again in 2016.

The goals of this conference are to foster:

- the existing partnerships between Czech and US congregations;
- the mission of the churches carried out by Diakonie and other outreach projects;
- theological exchange in the common quest for appropriate forms of our witness; and
- seeking new ways of doing things together and starting new partnerships.

There will be reflection and appreciation of the past 28 years of the various forms of the partnership as well as sharing recent experiences. There will be theological reflection of both the partnership and the present situation of our churches. There will be opportunities to share our concerns and dreams with our overseas partners. There will also be opportunities to worship together, to enjoy the diversity of Atlanta and its culture, as well as to visit congregations involved in partnerships in the United States.

Atlanta is a vibrant city with a complex recent history. It was both a racially segregated city and "the city too busy to hate" during the Civil Rights movement of the 1950's and 1960's. It is in a state (Georgia) that voted for President Trump and that also contains the most racial-ethnically diverse city in the United States. It has many churches with active memberships of over 5,000 people and many citizens who refuse to attend church. It has hosted the Olympics and is the birthplace of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. This April, as we meet in Atlanta, we will explore the city but, more importantly, we will explore the shape and value of Christian hope for a complex world.

The conference will take place at the Harrington Center at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia. It will begin on Monday afternoon, April 1st, and conclude on Friday morning, April 5th when attendees depart to spend the weekend with their partner churches. If you can come early, please join us for worship on March 31st at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Athens. The cost for the conference is either \$425.00 (double room) or \$625.00 (single room) and includes housing, meals, local ground transportation, and program materials.

We look forward to seeing you at the conference.
